

WHEREAS; glaucoma is a general term referring to a collection of eye disorders that cause damage to the optic nerve due to a buildup of fluid, putting excess pressure on the eye; and

WHEREAS; according to the National Eye Institute, there are several types of primary glaucoma, including open-angle glaucoma, angle-closure glaucoma, normal-tension glaucoma, and congenital glaucoma, and glaucoma caused by different medical conditions is known as secondary glaucoma; and

WHEREAS; glaucoma can develop at any age, but it is most common in people over the age of 60, as well as in people with certain medical conditions, Black, Asian, or Hispanic individuals, and people with a family history of the condition; and

WHEREAS; signs and symptoms of glaucoma vary by type and stage but often entail patchy or blurred vision, severe eye pain, headaches, eye discoloration, or changes in peripheral vision; and

WHEREAS; often, early signs of glaucoma go unnoticed by affected individuals, which is why screening for glaucoma in the form of regular comprehensive eye exams is key to preventing the condition and detecting it in its early stages; and

WHEREAS; while optic nerve damage and vision loss from glaucoma are irreversible, treatments, including eyedrops, laser treatments, and surgeries, can lower eye pressure, alleviate symptoms, halt the progression of damage to the optic nerve, and prevent further vision loss and blindness, especially if treated early; and

WHEREAS; this month, the state of Wisconsin joins affected individuals and their families, along with dedicated advocates and organizations across the state, in encouraging all Wisconsinites to become familiar with their family's eye health history and take the necessary steps to prevent glaucoma and maintain their eye health;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin,
