WHEREAS; according to the National Fire Protection Association, in 2022, fires were responsible for 3,790 civilian deaths across the United States, and 72 percent of these fatalities occurred at home; and

WHEREAS; Community Risk Reduction is a data-informed, multi-stakeholder process to identify and prioritize local fire and medical risks that also engages an integrated and strategic investment of resources to decrease their occurrence and alleviate their impact within communities; and

WHEREAS; the goal of Community Risk Reduction is to increase public safety and awareness and emergency preparedness for community members and emergency response professionals through concerted action in the areas of the five E's: education, engineering, enforcement, emergency response, and economic incentive; and

WHEREAS: this week, the state of Wisconsin commends all first responders and fire service professionals across the state who are dedicated to reducing the occurrence of all-hazard risks, injuries, and damages and appreciates the value of community support from local, state, and national partners to address public safety;
