Proclamation

WHEREAS; lasting from August 2, 1990, to February 28, 1991, the Gulf War was a coalition effort led by the United States against Iraq in response to the occupation of Kuwait; and

WHEREAS; this year marks the 35th anniversary of Operation Desert Storm, the Gulf War's major combat mission, which began on January 17, 1991; and

WHEREAS; according to the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, many Gulf War veterans have experienced a wide range of medically unexplained chronic illnesses and symptoms presumptively connected to their service; and

WHEREAS; today, the state of Wisconsin joins all Wisconsinites in recognizing and honoring the brave members of the U.S. Armed Forces who suffer illnesses as a result of their service in the Gulf War;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, do hereby proclaim January 17, 2026, as

GULF WAR ILLNESSES RECOGNITION DAY


throughout the State of Wisconsin, and I commend this observance to all our state's residents.
