WHEREAS; for every great achievement in American history, it is also important to recognize the cost at which progress has been made and the history of oppression, injustice, and hardship that is core to understanding the story of America; and

WHEREAS; this month, in reflecting on the collective past of the state and nation, the state of Wisconsin joins Wisconsinites in honoring American history and the shared values on which the country was founded of life, liberty, and equality for all;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, do hereby proclaim February 2024 as
