WHEREAS; perianesthesia nurses work in diverse medical care settings to provide competent, specialized care to patients who are undergoing or have experienced sedation, analgesia, or anesthesia for surgical, diagnostic, or therapeutic procedures; and

WHEREAS; perianesthesia nursing plays an essential role in the safety of patients and quality of healthcare across the state, and perianesthesia nurses continuously meet the varied and emerging needs of patients in a range of environments, including, but not limited to, obstetrical units, dental offices, hospitals, and ambulatory surgery centers; and

WHEREAS; as the American population ages, advancements in medicine raise life expectancies, and home healthcare services expand, the demand for perianesthesia nurses is expected to increase, and the services and care they provide will remain an important part of the American healthcare system; and

WHEREAS; this week, the state of Wisconsin joins dedicated advocates and organizations across the state in celebrating the perianesthesia workforce and recognizing perianesthesia nurses for their steadfast commitment to patient care, the continued advancement of nursing practices, and their contributions to the Wisconsin healthcare system;
