

WHEREAS; Transit Equity Day is a nationally recognized day of action held every year on February 4th to commemorate the birthday of the iconic civil rights leader Rosa Parks; and

WHEREAS; protecting the right to transit mobility and accessibility means ensuring that all individuals have access to convenient, affordable, and equitable transit services, and Transit Equity Day recognizes the connection between this idea and Rosa Parks' historic role in reducing barriers to public transportation through the Montgomery bus boycott; and

WHEREAS; Transit Equity Day also elevates the message that providing access to affordable, accessible, clean, and safe transit and paratransit alternatives can be a means to combat climate change; and

WHEREAS; Wisconsin's public transit infrastructure is vital to the social and economic livelihood of Wisconsinites across the state by creating jobs and helping folks get to and from work, school, doctor's appointments, and so much more; and

WHEREAS; ensuring safe, functional, affordable, and accessible transportation options and infrastructure while centering sustainability and equity in designing and investing in Wisconsin's transit systems remains a priority for the state; and

WHEREAS; today, the state of Wisconsin affirms that public transit is an essential service and that all people—regardless of race, ability, age, income, or identity—have the right to transit mobility and transit accessibility;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin,
