WHEREAS; observed annually on the third Friday in February, National Caregivers Day is a day to recognize and honor the dedicated people who provide long-term, in-home, and hospice care, whether professionally or to family members in an unpaid capacity; and

WHEREAS; caregivers deliver a variety of critical services with compassion and professionalism, ranging from personal care, dressing, medication management, and healthcare coordination to complex medical and nursing tasks; and

WHEREAS; like many industries today, the paid direct care and caregiving workforce in Wisconsin is facing a hiring and retention crisis, which has resulted in persistent vacancies in care facilities and a lack of sufficient services for people with disabilities, aging and older adults, and their families, requiring more family members to provide care to their loved ones; and

WHEREAS; according to data from AARP, in 2023, there were approximately 580,000 family caregivers in Wisconsin who provided roughly 540 million hours of unpaid family care, valued at an estimated \$9.2 billion; and

WHEREAS; many family caregivers often struggle to meet their own personal and occupational needs, as well as the needs of others in their households, and they, too, require support; and

WHEREAS; despite its often-rewarding nature, caregiving can be a demanding job, and resources and services to support caregivers are available statewide through the Wisconsin Department of Health Services and local aging and disability resource centers, affirming the needs of not just those who depend on caregivers but the caregivers themselves, too; and

WHEREAS; today, the state of Wisconsin recognizes the innumerable contributions and personal sacrifices that both paid and unpaid caregivers make in service to the health and wellbeing of Wisconsin's communities and reaffirms its commitment to expanding services and resources that support caregivers throughout the state and to ensuring that all Wisconsinites who depend on the services of caregivers have access to affordable, quality care;

> NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, do hereby proclaim February 21 2025 as

NATIONAL CAREGIVERS DAY

throughout the State of Wisconsin and I commend this observance to all our state's residents.
