WHEREAS; treatment for problem gambling may include therapy, medication, or self-help groups and may occur in conjunction with treatment for substance misuse, depression, anxiety, or other mental health issues; and

WHEREAS; the Wisconsin Council on Problem Gambling provides gambling disorder resources and education, and free and confidential help is available through their helpline 1-800-GAMBLE-5; and

WHEREAS; this month, the state of Wisconsin joins the National Council on Problem Gambling and the Wisconsin Council on Problem Gambling in spreading awareness of problem gambling and encouraging all Wisconsinites to talk with friends, family, patients, and clients about recognizing and preventing a potential gambling disorder;
