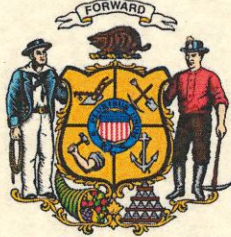


*NOW, THEREFORE*, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, do hereby proclaim March 2026 as

## PROBLEM GAMBLING AWARENESS MONTH


throughout the State of Wisconsin, and I commend this observance to all our state's residents.
