WHEREAS; during the Year of the Kid, the state of Wisconsin remains committed to advancing and supporting innovative initiatives to increase vital mental and behavioral health services in Wisconsin schools, including measures to hire more pupil service professionals like social workers, as well as supporting the overall, long-term success of the social work industry; and

WHEREAS; this week, the state of Wisconsin joins all Wisconsinites in thanking school social workers across the state for the important work they do to promote the academic, social, emotional, and personal success of Wisconsin's students so they can be their best and fullest selves both in and outside the classroom;
