WHEREAS; the theme of this year's International Women's Day, "Inspire Inclusion," aims to cultivate a more inclusive world for women through understanding the value of diverse voices and encouraging women and advocates to promote inclusion so that everyone feels a sense of belonging and empowerment; and

WHEREAS; today, the state of Wisconsin joins all Wisconsinites in reflecting on the countless contributions of women to the state, country, and world and in uniting in the fight for the liberation of all women and all people;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, do hereby proclaim March 8 2024 as

INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY

throughout the State of Wisconsin and I commend this observance to all our state's residents.
