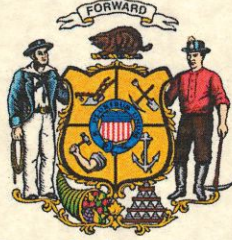


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin,

HISTOTECHNOLOGY PROFESSIONALS DAY


throughout the State of Wisconsin, and I commend this observance
