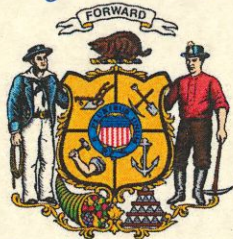

# Proclamation

*WHEREAS*; Wisconsin has a proud history of maple syrup production and is home to a thriving community of industry professionals who produce hundreds of thousands of gallons of maple syrup every year; and

*WHEREAS*; underscoring Wisconsin's deep connection and commitment to the maple syrup industry, the sugar maple has been the official state tree since 1949; and

*WHEREAS*; with thousands of maple producers operating over 1.1 million taps, Wisconsin ranks among the leading maple syrup-producing states in the nation and is a leader in the value of maple syrup production, yielding a significant economic impact to the state each year, according to data from the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA); and

*WHEREAS*; further according to the USDA, Wisconsinites produced 556,000 gallons of maple syrup in 2025, contributing directly to the economic, culinary, and cultural values of the state; and

*WHEREAS*; the first "tree tapping" of the year in Wisconsin will take place at Bauer Valley Maples in Cazenovia, Wisconsin, on March 14, 2026; and

*WHEREAS*; this month, the state of Wisconsin joins maple producers and industry professionals in recognizing the significant historical, economic, and cultural impact of maple syrup production in Wisconsin;


*NOW, THEREFORE*, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin,

## MAPLE MONTH


throughout the State of Wisconsin, and I commend this observance
