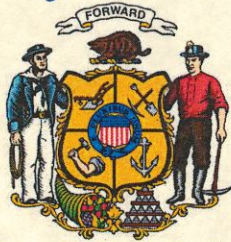

Proclamation

WHEREAS; the Medal of Honor is the highest award for bravery and courage in combat across all branches of the United States military; and

WHEREAS; following legislation passed by Congress and signed by President Abraham Lincoln, the first six Medals of Honor were awarded on March 25, 1863; and

WHEREAS; in the 163 years since the Medal of Honor was created, fewer than four thousand individuals—including more than 60 Wisconsinites—have received this prestigious honor; and

WHEREAS; today, the state of Wisconsin honors all recipients of the Medal of Honor for their service, sacrifice, valor, and heroism in combat;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, do hereby proclaim March 25, 2026, as

NATIONAL MEDAL OF HONOR DAY

throughout the State of Wisconsin, and I commend this observance to all our state's residents.
