WHEREAS; it is estimated that the polio vaccine has prevented 20 million cases of paralysis and saved 1.5 million lives worldwide since 1988, underscoring the vital need and importance of vaccines; and

WHEREAS; due to scientific research and discovery, Wisconsinites and people around the world have experienced longer and healthier lives, greater convenience and comfort, and enhanced prosperity and quality of life; and

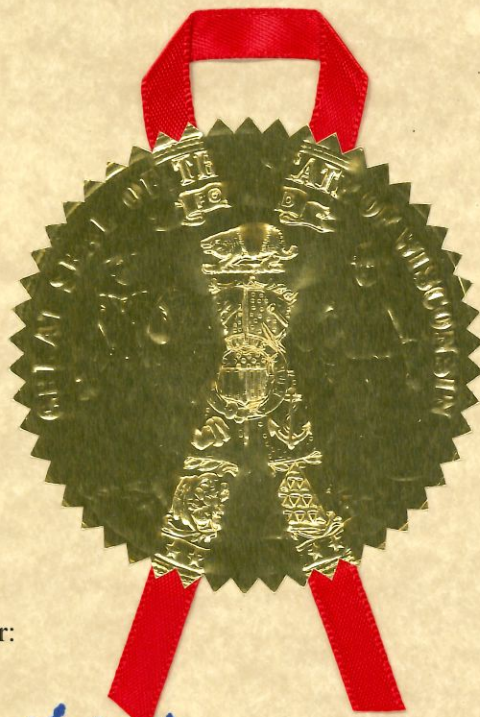
WHEREAS; with the challenges facing the world today, it has never been more essential to listen to experts in the scientific community, trust science, and fight against disinformation in all forms; and


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin,
