# Proclamation

*WHEREAS*; while the conflict has its roots as far back as the 1800s, the Vietnam War, as it is known today, began in the 1950s as a struggle between North Vietnam and its allies and South Vietnam, supported by its own ally nations, including the United States; and

*WHEREAS*; the first American ground combat units arrived in Vietnam in March 1965, and the United States' involvement lasted until the capture of the city of Saigon by the North Vietnamese on April 30, 1975; and

*WHEREAS*; approximately 165,400 Wisconsinites bravely served the United States during the Vietnam War, and over 1,200 Wisconsinites made the ultimate sacrifice in service to their country; and

*WHEREAS*; it is essential to acknowledge the thousands of Hmong-Lao people who courageously fought alongside Americans throughout the Vietnam War and that Wisconsin is home to a significant number of Hmong-Lao veterans who were forced to flee their homelands following the war's end; and

*WHEREAS*; March 29th of every year is designated as a day to express the state's deep gratitude for veterans of the Vietnam War and to thank them for their service and sacrifice; and

*WHEREAS*; today, the state of Wisconsin joins all Wisconsinites in honoring the dedication, resilience, and selflessness of all individuals who bravely served the nation during the Vietnam War, as well as the sacrifices of their families and loved ones;

*NOW, THEREFORE*, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, do hereby proclaim March 29, 2026, as

throughout the State of Wisconsin, and I commend this observance to all our state's residents.
