

WHEREAS; Fabry disease is a progressive genetic disorder that, if not properly diagnosed and treated, has the potential to diminish quality of life and lead to premature death due to stroke, kidney failure, and heart failure; and

WHEREAS; caused by a deficiency of the enzyme alpha-galactosidase A, Fabry disease has two types, classic and late-onset, both characterized by a buildup of lipids in the body, leading to cell and organ damage, according to Cleveland Clinic; and

WHEREAS; symptoms of Fabry Disease are dependent on the type, and there are few approved treatments available for Fabry disease because it remains severely under-diagnosed; and

WHEREAS; healthcare providers and families should be aware of the symptoms of Fabry disease and, if warranted, obtain a GLA gene test that can definitively assess the presence of this disorder; and

WHEREAS; while there is no cure for Fabry disease, early detection, diagnosis, and treatment are key to preventing irreversible damage to the body and protecting individual's overall quality of life; and

WHEREAS; this month, the state of Wisconsin joins affected individuals, families, dedicated advocates, and organizations across the state in working towards increased awareness, quicker and more accurate diagnoses, and greater support for all those affected by Fabry disease across the state;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin,
