

WHEREAS; observed annually during the month of April, National Donate Life Month highlights the importance of organ, eye, and tissue donation to saving lives across the state and country; and

WHEREAS; according to the Health Resources and Services Administration, every organ donor can save up to eight lives and positively impact over 75 more; and

WHEREAS; currently, there are more than 1,400 Wisconsinites—and more than 100,000 people nationwide—on the national waitlist for an organ transplant, according to the Wisconsin Department of Health Services, and every day, an average of 17 people die waiting for a transplant; and

WHEREAS; nearly every person in Wisconsin can register to be an organ, tissue, and eye donor online or at their local Division of Motor Vehicles; and

WHEREAS; according to the Organ Procurement and Transplantation Network, the year 2022 marked the one millionth organ transplant performed in the United States, a testament to the life-saving work of organ procurement organizations and countless registered organ donors across the country; and

WHEREAS; this month, the state of Wisconsin honors the nearly three million registered organ, tissue, and eye donors across the state for their generosity and encourages all eligible Wisconsinites to register as donors, support local blood drives, and give the gift of life through donation;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin,
