

WHEREAS; according to Cleveland Clinic, congenital diaphragmatic hernia (CDH) occurs during fetal development when the diaphragm does not fully form, and as a result, abdominal organs can enter the chest cavity and prevent lung growth; and

WHEREAS; Cleveland Clinic further states that CDH affects one in every 2,500 to 3,500 live births in the United States, including many in Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS; often enduring multiple surgeries, individuals with CDH can experience medical complications, which can include pulmonary complications, gastric and intestinal problems, and developmental delays, and may require ongoing respiratory and medicinal support; and

WHEREAS; while the cause of CDH is unknown, raising awareness of CDH can help bring about acceptance and support for those living with the condition and help affected families advocate for urgently needed medical research and advances; and

WHEREAS; this month, the state of Wisconsin recognizes the families across the state that have endured the loss, grief, and pain associated with the loss of a loved one with CDH and joins individuals, advocates, and organizations across Wisconsin in increasing awareness of the condition, promoting research, and working towards improved patient care and outcomes;
