WHEREAS; jazz serves as an expression of freedom for people in the United States and beyond and has become an international language that brings people together and bridges differences across all backgrounds; and

WHEREAS; throughout U.S. history, jazz has inspired dancers, choreographers, poets, novelists, filmmakers, classical composers, and musicians and has helped unite cultures in a global environment, contributing to the facilitation of arts education and appreciation across communities; and

WHEREAS; Wisconsin has historically been home to a thriving jazz scene, with the Bronzeville District of Milwaukee at its heart, and notable jazz icons from Wisconsin include Bunny Berigan, Woody Herman, Al Jarreau, and Les Paul; and

WHEREAS; Wisconsin’s jazz heritage should be celebrated and included in musical education and appreciation everywhere; and

WHEREAS; this month, the state of Wisconsin joins communities, musicians, schools, artists, historians, and jazz enthusiasts around the world in recognizing the outstanding work of the state’s jazz artists and educators and in celebrating jazz as an art form that strives to promote peace, diversity, and freedom of expression;
