

WHEREAS; the Tamil language is among the longest-surviving classical languages in the world and is widely spoken throughout India, Singapore, and Sri Lanka, as well as by many Wisconsin families across the state; and

WHEREAS; the Tamil New Year, also known as Puthandu or Puthuvarudam, is the first day of the year on the Tamil calendar and is traditionally celebrated as a festival; and

WHEREAS; aligned with the solar cycle of the lunisolar calendar, Tamil New Year is celebrated on the first day of the Tamil month Chithirai and typically falls on or around April 14 every year on the Gregorian calendar; and

WHEREAS; on this occasion, Tamil people greet one another by saying “Puthāṇḍu vāazhthugal!” (புத்தாண்டு வாழ்த்துக்கள்) or “Iniya puthaandu nalvāazhthugal!” (இனிய புத்தாண்டு நல்வாழ்த்துக்கள்), which is equivalent to “Happy New Year” in English; and

WHEREAS; this month, the state of Wisconsin joins dedicated organizations, cultural groups, and Tamil people across the state in celebrating the vibrant culture and longstanding history of the Tamil community in Wisconsin, and wishes a happy new year to all who celebrate;;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin,
do hereby proclaim April 14 2026 as

TAMIL NEW YEAR

throughout the State of Wisconsin and I commend this observance
to all our state’s residents.
