Proclamation

WHEREAS; whether taking a walk along the scenic Lake Michigan lakefront, spending a day at the Milwaukee Art Museum, catching a Bucks game at Fiserv Forum or a Brewers game at American Family Field, rocking out at Summerfest, or enjoying any one of the city's award-winning local restaurants and breweries, Milwaukee has something for everyone and is home to countless iconic personalities, parks, local businesses, and one-of-a-kind events; and

WHEREAS; centered around the 414 area code, which covers Milwaukee County and its 19 municipalities, Milwaukee Day is celebrated on 4/14 each year for more than half a million Milwaukeeans—and countless Milwaukeeans at heart—to join in activities that promote and celebrate Milwaukee; and

WHEREAS; today, the state of Wisconsin joins the entire Milwaukee community in celebrating Milwaukee Day, honoring the city's proud history, and reflecting on Milwaukee's countless contributions to the fabric of the state and country;

MILWAUKEE DAY


throughout the State of Wisconsin, and I commend this observance
