WHEREAS; from singers and teachers to lawyers, salespeople, and beyond, millions of individuals rely on their voices for their work and day-to-day lives; and

WHEREAS; according to a study published by the National Institutes of Health, 29.9 million Americans each year report voice-related issues, and research suggests that voice conditions affect one in eight adults annually; and

WHEREAS; a diagnosis of a voice disorder can be life-altering and can affect an individual's relationships, employment, social activities, and self-esteem; and

WHEREAS; several factors can lead to a voice disorder, such as smoking, allergies, aging, voice misuse or overuse, various illnesses, diseases, and cancers that impact the larynx or vocal folds; and

WHEREAS; voice conditions such as laryngitis, spasmodic dysphonia, vocal tremor, vocal cord paresis, or paralysis can affect anyone, and treatments can range from rest and voice therapy to surgery, underscoring the importance of increased public awareness, understanding, and support to advance treatments, therapies, and research; and

WHEREAS; today, the state of Wisconsin joins dedicated advocates, organizations, and Wisconsinites living with voice disorders and their loved ones in raising awareness about voice conditions and encouraging all to learn about vocal health and seek medical treatment when necessary;
