WHEREAS; demonstrating an unwavering commitment to the evolving needs of patrons and consistently advocating for the free exchange of information that is essential to the strength of democracy, libraries, librarians, and library staff are invaluable partners to communities across the state, and protecting and investing in public libraries has never been more important; and

WHEREAS; this week, the state of Wisconsin joins libraries, librarians, library staff, supporters, and advocates in encouraging all Wisconsinites to sign up for a library card, visit their local library, and support local libraries across the state;

NATIONAL LIBRARY WEEK


throughout the State of Wisconsin and I commend this observance
