

WHEREAS; APOL1-Mediated Kidney Disease (AMKD) is a severe form of kidney disease caused by mutations in one or both APOL1 genes, the genes that play a role in bodily immunity and disease prevention; and

WHEREAS; according to the American Kidney Fund, APOL1 genetic mutations are passed down from parents, and people who are Black, Hispanic, or Latino are often at an increased risk for such gene mutations or developing kidney disease; and

WHEREAS; symptoms of an APOL1 gene mutation may include protein in the urine, leg swelling, weight gain, fatigue, or high blood pressure, and genetic testing is needed to determine if mutations are prevalent since symptoms may not appear until the kidneys are close to failure; and

WHEREAS; while there are no treatments currently available for AMKD, affected individuals should meet with their doctor to prevent or delay potential kidney disease, underscoring the importance of increased awareness and research; and

WHEREAS; today, the state of Wisconsin joins all affected individuals, their families, and dedicated advocates and organizations across the state in spreading awareness of AMKD and embracing hope for improved treatments and a cure;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin,
