WHEREAS; the vibrant and distinct cultures of AAPI communities in Wisconsin—from families who have lived in Wisconsin for generations to recent immigrants and refugees—are a fundamental part of the state's identity; and

WHEREAS; the state of Wisconsin recognizes that this year's celebration comes during an increased time of racism and violence aimed towards the AAPI community and reiterates its support for the continuous efforts of the AAPI Coalition of Wisconsin and its mission to confront violence, discrimination, racism, and hate of all kinds; and

WHEREAS; this month, the state of Wisconsin celebrates AAPI communities across the state and joins the AAPI Coalition of Wisconsin in working to ensure that all feel safe, welcomed, and included in Wisconsin;
