

WHEREAS; according to the National Library of Medicine (NLBM), approximately 1,000 deaths in the United States are the result of electrical injuries per year, and almost all are accidental and often preventable; and

WHEREAS; according to the NLBM, nearly 20 percent of all electrical injuries occur in children, while electrical injuries are also the fourth-leading cause of workplace-related deaths, underscoring the need for electrical safety precautions in the home and workplace; and

WHEREAS; Wisconsinites are encouraged to inspect their homes and workplaces for possible electrical hazards and use safety technology such as ground-fault circuit interrupters, tamper-resistant receptacles, and other devices as appropriate; and

WHEREAS; ensuring that all members of the household and workplace are familiar with the sounds of their smoke alarms and that emergency alarms meet the needs of those with physical or sensory disabilities can help reduce electrical-related injuries and deaths; and


