WHEREAS; ADRCs are devoted to helping individuals and families make informed decisions, preserve personal resources, delay or avoid the need for possible expensive long-term care services, and maintain independence; and

WHEREAS; this month, the state of Wisconsin joins individuals and organizations across the state, including the Wisconsin Department of Health Services, in celebrating ADRCs and their many contributions to folks and families across Wisconsin;
