WHEREAS; according to DONA International, the world's first, largest, and leading doula-certifying organization, doulas are trained professionals who provide continuous physical, emotional, and informational support to clients before, during, and after childbirth to help them achieve the healthiest, safest, and most satisfying experience possible; and

WHEREAS; every Wisconsinite deserves respectful and responsive maternal care, and doulas provide services to uplift and amplify their clients' voices in a variety of settings; and

WHEREAS; doulas play an important role in addressing gaps in the perinatal workforce, and research suggests that doulas can reduce birth complications, especially in communities of color, and that their support can help shorten labor duration, decrease the likelihood of cesarean birth and low birth weights, and increase success in breastfeeding; and

WHEREAS; this month, the state of Wisconsin joins advocates, birth workers, medical professionals, dedicated individuals, and organizations across the state in celebrating doulas for their dedicated service to protecting and promoting the health, safety, and overall well-being of Wisconsin mothers and babies;
