

WHEREAS; according to the Wisconsin Community Action Program Association (WISCAP), one in 10 Wisconsinites live below the federal poverty line and face barriers to accessing safe, stable, affordable housing and child care, living wage employment, and healthy, sufficient food for themselves and their family; and

WHEREAS; community action agencies are robust state and local forces that can be found in almost every county in the United States and help connect local folks and families to critical services while creating economic opportunities and pathways to prosperity for low-income individuals; and

WHEREAS; since 1974, community action agencies in Wisconsin have contributed to policy development, community support and advocacy, and programming in the areas of affordable housing, weatherization, food security, employment, entrepreneurship, child development, community economic development, health, and education; and

WHEREAS; Wisconsin's community action agencies are committed to incorporating and amplifying the voices of the people living in the communities they serve, with a board structure that includes low-income individuals and families, elected officials or their representatives, and local professionals, groups, and interests; and

WHEREAS; WISCAP is comprised of several community action agencies and two single-purpose agencies with a statewide focus that work together to fight poverty and help Wisconsinites achieve economic self-sufficiency; and

WHEREAS; this month, the state of Wisconsin renews its resolve to work with community action agencies and partners to fight inequities, reduce economic disparities, and provide resources and support to individuals, families, and communities across the state;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin,
do hereby proclaim May 2026 as

throughout the State of Wisconsin and I commend this observance
to all our state's residents.
