*WHEREAS*; National Bike to School Day is an annual celebration that encourages biking to school and generates awareness of the significance of creating and preserving safe and accessible walking and bike paths in communities throughout the United States; and

*WHEREAS*; today, the state of Wisconsin encourages students, families, and community members to commute by bike and joins communities across the state in supporting initiatives to increase equitable, accessible, and safe biking opportunities for all Wisconsinites;

*NOW, THEREFORE*, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin,
