*WHEREAS*; Wisconsin's mental health providers are frontline workers dedicated to improving the mental health of individuals, couples, kids, families, and communities; and

*WHEREAS*; by creating environments where all people can be heard and receive essential support, mental health providers are champions of wellness, defenders of privacy, and advocates for hope and a brighter future; and

*WHEREAS*; the state remains committed to expanding access to mental and behavioral healthcare services across the state, including investments to support the strength of the mental health workforce and ensure the state has access to adequate, available, and affordable mental health professionals to provide the high-quality treatment Wisconsinites need and depend on; and

*WHEREAS*; today, the state of Wisconsin affirms that mental and behavioral healthcare is healthcare and joins Wisconsinites in thanking and honoring the dedicated mental health providers working across the state for their critical contributions to the overall health and well-being of all Wisconsinites;

*NOW, THEREFORE*, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin,
