

WHEREAS; congenital disorders of glycosylation (CDG) refer to a group of metabolic conditions that affect organ development and the neurological system, often resulting in physical and developmental disabilities; and

WHEREAS; according to the CDG Community Alliance and Resource Exchange, CDG affects approximately 350 people in the United States and an estimated 1,800 people worldwide; and

WHEREAS; early and proper diagnosis of CDG is essential to ensure timely management of clinical complications, genetic counseling, and treatment or therapeutic options, yet the condition remains acutely under-diagnosed and misdiagnosed, leading to challenges in accessing specialized services, rehabilitation, and support for affected individuals; and

WHEREAS; today, the state of Wisconsin joins all affected individuals and their loved ones, along with dedicated advocates and organizations across the state, in raising awareness of CDG with the hope of increasing its accurate and timely diagnosis;

CONGENITAL DISORDERS OF GLYCOSYLATION AWARENESS DAY

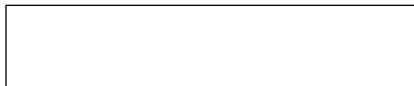
throughout the State of Wisconsin and I commend this observance
