Proclamation

WHEREAS; congenital disorders of glycosylation (CDG) refer to a group of metabolic conditions that affect organ development and the neurological system, often resulting in physical and developmental disabilities; and

WHEREAS; while CDG affects communities throughout the nation and world, the condition remains acutely under-diagnosed and misdiagnosed, leading to challenges in accessing specialized services, rehabilitation, and support for affected individuals; and

WHEREAS; early and proper diagnosis of CDG is essential to ensure timely management of clinical complications, genetic counseling, and treatment or therapeutic options; and

WHEREAS; today, the state of Wisconsin joins all affected individuals and their loved ones, along with dedicated advocates and organizations across the state, in raising awareness of CDG with the hope of increasing accurate and timely diagnosis;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin,
do hereby proclaim May 16, 2024, as

CONGENITAL DISORDERS OF GLYCOSYLATION AWARENESS DAY

throughout the State of Wisconsin, and I commend this observance
to all our state's residents.
