

WHEREAS; Tarlov Cyst Disease (TCD) is a rare disease characterized by the formation of cerebrospinal fluid-filled sacs in the nerve roots in the spine, most commonly near the base of the spine; and

WHEREAS; according to the Cleveland Clinic, while studies show that only five to eight percent of those diagnosed with TCD experience symptoms, individuals who do experience symptoms may experience varying levels of lower back pain, usually defined by cyst location and associated nerve distribution, numbness, and headaches; and

WHEREAS; TCD pain often mimics other conditions, making the disease difficult to diagnose, and tests, including MRI or CT scans, are often needed for accurate diagnoses; and

WHEREAS; today, the state of Wisconsin joins all those affected by TCD, along with dedicated medical professionals, advocates, and organizations across the state, in spreading awareness of the disease with the goal of furthering research on the origins of the disease, ensuring better diagnoses, and developing non-invasive treatments and neurosurgical procedures;
