WHEREAS; neurofibromatosis (NF) is a group of three genetic disorders distinguished by the growth of tumors on nerves throughout the body of an affected individual, possibly impacting the development of the brain, cardiovascular system, bones, and skin; and

WHEREAS; NF can cause blindness, deafness, bone abnormalities, disfigurement, learning disabilities, debilitating pain, and cancer, and according to the Neurofibromatosis Clinics Association, it impacts two million people worldwide; and

WHEREAS; despite the prevalence of NF, a lack of awareness persists, and work remains to ensure the early diagnosis, proper management and treatment, and prevention of complications of NF in all affected people; and

WHEREAS; today, the state of Wisconsin joins patients, families, advocates, and dedicated organizations in raising awareness of neurofibromatosis, supporting additional research, and working to increase access to treatment and prevention services for those affected in Wisconsin, across the country, and around the world;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, do hereby proclaim May 17 2024 as
