Proclamation

WHEREAS; neurofibromatosis (NF) is a group of genetic disorders distinguished by the growth of tumors on nerves throughout the body of an affected individual, possibly impacting the development of the brain, cardiovascular system, bones, and skin; and

WHEREAS; according to the Neurofibromatosis Clinics Association (NFCA), there are three categories of NF—NF1, NF2, and schwannomatosis; and

WHEREAS; according to the NFCA, NF impact more than 2 million people worldwide and can cause blindness, deafness, bone abnormalities, disfigurement, learning disabilities, debilitating pain, and cancer; and

WHEREAS; according to the National Institutes of Health, about half of those living with NF inherit the condition from a parent, and genetic testing may be needed to correctly diagnose individuals who feature symptoms of NF without a known family history; and

WHEREAS; despite the prevalence of NF, a lack of awareness in the public persists, and work remains to ensure the early diagnosis, proper management and treatment, and prevention of complications of NF in all affected people; and

WHEREAS; today, the state of Wisconsin joins patients, families, advocates, and dedicated organizations in raising awareness of neurofibromatosis, supporting additional research, and working to increase access to treatment and services for those affected in Wisconsin, across the country, and around the world;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, do hereby proclaim May 17, 2025, as

throughout the State of Wisconsin, and I commend this observance to all our state's residents.
