Proclamation

WHEREAS; credit unions are not-for-profit, member-owned cooperatives that provide essential financial services and education to consumers in Wisconsin and around the country; and

WHEREAS; just as the guiding philosophy of the credit union industry is “people helping people,” credit unions cooperate and collaborate with one another under the principle of “credit unions helping credit unions”; and

WHEREAS; nearly 2,000 credit unions throughout Wisconsin and across the country cooperate to share their branches and better serve their 65 million members nationwide at more than 5,200 of these shared branches—known as CO-OP Shared Branches—including 40 in Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS; through the power of cooperation, shared branching is the largest branch network among all U.S. financial institutions and the only one with locations in all 50 states; and

WHEREAS; Wisconsin credit unions have shared branches since 1996 to provide greater convenience and enhance access to financial services to members who travel, relocate, retire, graduate, change jobs, and so much more; and

WHEREAS; this week, the state of Wisconsin celebrates shared branching as a symbol of the cooperative spirit of the state’s credit unions;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin,
do hereby proclaim May 18 – 22, 2026, as

throughout the State of Wisconsin, and I commend this observance
to all our state’s residents.
