WHEREAS; gout is a chronic disease caused by uric acid build-up in the joints and characterized by sudden and excruciating painful flares; and

WHEREAS; gout affects more than eight million people in the United States, according to the National Kidney Foundation, making it the most common form of inflammatory arthritis; and

WHEREAS; while members of historically underserved communities, and Black patients, in particular, are more likely to develop gout than white patients, disparities persist in the prescription of urate-lowering medications and access to ongoing, routine provider care; and

WHEREAS; stigma, lack of awareness, and misinformation may hinder treatment for gout; and

WHEREAS; today, the state of Wisconsin joins affected individuals and their families, along with dedicated advocates and organizations across the state and country, in raising public awareness of gout in order to reduce the stigma and empower patients to seek quality care and timely treatment;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, do hereby proclaim May 22 2023 as

GOUT AWARENESS DAY

throughout the State of Wisconsin and I commend this observance to all our state's residents.
