WHEREAS; dairy farmers have shown immense strength and resilience —especially as they have worked tirelessly to feed Wisconsin and the world throughout the immense challenges of the last few years—and Wisconsin is proud to continue to support their success with investments in research to expand the industry, additional resources for dairy processors, and efforts to bolster dairy exports, ensuring Wisconsin continues to be well-positioned for future opportunities and to be a global leader in the dairy sector; and

WHEREAS; this month, the state of Wisconsin reaffirms its commitment to serving as a steadfast partner to farmers, the agricultural industry, and rural communities and joins all Wisconsinites in honoring dairy farmers and all members of the state's dairy industry for their continued hard work and contributions;
