WHEREAS; according to the World Health Organization, headache disorders are among the most common disorders of the nervous system, affecting approximately 40 percent of the global population; and

WHEREAS; despite headache prevalence, many of those afflicted do not receive proper diagnoses and medical care; and

WHEREAS; primary headaches, such as migraines, occur independently of underlying medical issues and serve as the dominant medical symptom, while secondary headaches occur as a result of an underlying medical condition; and

WHEREAS; the effects of headache disorders present at different levels of intensity, frequency, and disability and can negatively impact individuals, especially those who suffer migraines, by causing personal suffering, impaired quality of life, decreased productivity, and emotional distress; and


