WHEREAS; all Americans and Wisconsinites deserve to live in communities that encourage and promote safe and healthy living, and preventing unintentional injuries and deaths requires the cooperation of all levels of government, employers, and the general public; and

WHEREAS; the summer months are a time of increased occurrences of unintentional injuries and deaths, and organizations across the state are dedicated to bringing attention to and educating Wisconsinites on injury risks and prevention; and

WHEREAS; this month, the state of Wisconsin reaffirms its commitment to promoting policies, practices, and procedures that will lead to increased safety, protection, and health in businesses and industries, on roads and highways, and in Wisconsin institutions, homes, and communities;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, do hereby proclaim June 2025 as
