## Proclamation

*WHEREAS*; the rate of unintentional injuries and deaths in the United States continues to occur at dangerous levels, with accidents and unintentional injuries as the third leading cause of death in the United States, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention; and

*WHEREAS*; with roughly 25.5 million emergency department visits being related to unintentional injuries nationwide, the cost of unintentional injuries to Americans and their employers is measured in billions of dollars each year and can present immense personal and financial challenges for individuals and their families; and

*WHEREAS*; all Americans and Wisconsinites deserve to live in communities that encourage and promote safe and healthy living, and preventing unintentional injuries and deaths requires the cooperation of all levels of government, employers, and the general public; and

*WHEREAS*; the summer months are a time of increased occurrences of unintentional injuries and deaths, and organizations across the state are dedicated to bringing attention to and educating Wisconsinites on injury risks and prevention; and

*WHEREAS*; this month, the state of Wisconsin reaffirms its commitment to promoting policies, practices, and procedures that will lead to increased safety, protection, and health in businesses and industries, on roads and highways, and in Wisconsin institutions, homes, and communities;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin,  
do hereby proclaim June 2025 as
