Proclamation

WHEREAS; according to the National Institutes of Health (NIH), vitiligo is a chronic autoimmune disorder that causes melanin-producing cells to stop functioning and, as a result, patches of skin to lose pigment or color; and

WHEREAS; it is estimated that vitiligo affects around one percent of the population worldwide, and the condition can develop at any age and in individuals of all genders, races, and ethnicities; and

WHEREAS; while the exact cause of vitiligo remains unknown, autoimmune conditions, family history, or frequent skin trauma may increase an individual's likelihood of developing vitiligo; and

WHEREAS; alongside common symptoms such as loss of skin color and skin sensitivity, individuals living with vitiligo may also experience psychological and social effects, including low self-esteem, which can significantly affect one's quality of life; and

WHEREAS; today, the state of Wisconsin joins dedicated individuals and organizations across the state in spreading awareness of vitiligo, providing advocacy and support for affected individuals, and promoting acceptance;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin,
do hereby proclaim June 2025 as

VITILIGO AWARENESS MONTH

throughout the State of Wisconsin, and I commend this observance
to all our state's residents.
