# Proclamation

*WHEREAS*; a cancer survivor is anyone living with a history of cancer, from their diagnosis through the rest of their life; and

*WHEREAS*; according to the American Cancer Society, as of 2022, there were more than 18 million cancer survivors in the country, and the state of Wisconsin is home to a growing population of cancer survivors; and

*WHEREAS*; the American Cancer Society further estimates that approximately 1.9 million new cancer cases will be diagnosed in the United States this year, including 37,640 in Wisconsin alone, which is why improved access to quality cancer care, screening, and prevention—particularly in historically underserved communities—must be a top priority of the state; and

*WHEREAS*; today, the state of Wisconsin joins all Wisconsinites in recognizing cancer survivors in the state and across the country for their strength, advocacy, and resilience;

*NOW, THEREFORE*, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin,  
do hereby proclaim June 4, 2023, as
