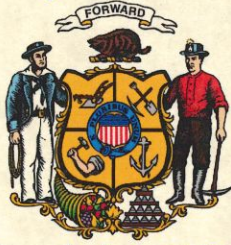

Proclamation

WHEREAS; a cancer survivor is anyone living with a history of cancer, from their diagnosis through the rest of their life; and

WHEREAS; according to the American Cancer Society, as of 2025, there were more than 18.6 million cancer survivors in the country, with the population of cancer survivors expected to exceed 22 million by 2035, including a growing population in Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS; the American Cancer Society estimates that more than 2 million new cancer cases will be diagnosed in the United States in 2026, including more than 40,000 in Wisconsin alone, which is why improved access to quality cancer care, screening, and prevention—particularly in historically underserved communities—must be a top priority of the state; and

WHEREAS; today, the state of Wisconsin joins all Wisconsinites in recognizing cancer survivors, as well as their families and loved ones, in the state and across the country for their strength, advocacy, and resilience;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin,
do hereby proclaim June 7, 2026, as

NATIONAL CANCER SURVIVORS DAY

throughout the State of Wisconsin, and I commend this observance
to all our state's residents.
