WHEREAS; beyond just physical care, nursing assistants provide mental, emotional, and social support for many of the state’s most vulnerable populations; and

WHEREAS; as Wisconsin’s population continues to age and as the state continues to face a healthcare workforce shortage, investing in bolstering and strengthening the healthcare and long-term care provider workforce continues to be a top priority to ensure the state can meet the healthcare needs of Wisconsinites today and in the future; and

WHEREAS; this week, the state of Wisconsin gives special thanks to nursing assistants for their demonstrated selflessness, sacrifice, and empathy, and joins all in recognizing the vital role nursing assistants play in the lives of Wisconsinites;
