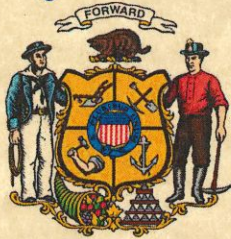

Proclamation

WHEREAS; first celebrated on June 20, 2001, World Refugee Day was originally recognized to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the 1951 Convention Relating to the Status of Refugees; and

WHEREAS; every year, World Refugee Day provides an opportunity to acknowledge and reflect on the resilience refugees have shown in the face of unimaginable circumstances, the new lives they have built for themselves and their families, and the positive impact they have on local communities; and

WHEREAS; Wisconsin has a rich history of opening its doors to people of all backgrounds, experiences, and walks of life; and

WHEREAS; the 2025 Wisconsin World Refugee Day theme "Walking Together, Weaving the World," weaves together efforts for unity and interconnectedness throughout refugee communities worldwide and the global community they belong to; and

WHEREAS; Wisconsin strives to always serve refugee communities with respect and dignity, acknowledging the hardships they have encountered, recognizing their courage, sacrifice, and resilience, and celebrating their vast and valuable contributions to communities and the state as a whole; and

WHEREAS; today, the state of Wisconsin proudly joins all Wisconsinites in spreading awareness of the issues affecting the world's refugees, honoring refugee communities, and supporting local agencies that serve refugees and their families here in Wisconsin, across the nation, and around the world;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin,
do hereby proclaim June 20, 2025, as

WORLD REFUGEE DAY

throughout the State of Wisconsin, and I commend this observance
to all our state's residents.
