# Proclamation

*WHEREAS*; originally inspired by France's national music holiday, Fête de la Musique, Make Music Day is a global one-day festival that celebrates the creation of music by encouraging musicians to perform in public spaces in more than 2,000 cities in 120 countries around the world; and

*WHEREAS*; in Wisconsin, Make Music Day involves both professional and amateur musicians, bands, orchestras, and ensembles making music in-person and virtually—all completely free for musicians and audiences alike—and showcases a diverse array of styles and genres, from classical and jazz to blues, folk, pop, rock, rap, hip-hop, and world music; and

*WHEREAS*; this year, the communities participating in Make Music Day Wisconsin include Amery, Appleton, Ashland, Baraboo, Beloit, Cable, Cambridge, Cross Plains, DeForest, Dodgeville, Green Bay, Hayward, Kenosha, Land O' Lakes, Madeline Island, Madison, Marshfield, Middleton, Milwaukee, Monona, Oshkosh, Platteville, Spooner-Shell Lake, Stevens Point, Sun Prairie, Superior, and Verona; and

*WHEREAS*; today, the state of Wisconsin joins the communities involved in Make Music Day Wisconsin in celebrating the creation of music and recognizing music as a universal language capable of uniting all Wisconsinites and people;

*NOW, THEREFORE*, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin,  
do hereby proclaim June 21, 2025, as
