Proclamation

WHEREAS; originally inspired by France's national music holiday, Fête de la Musique, and observed annually on the summer solstice, Make Music Day is a global one-day festival that celebrates the creation of music by encouraging musicians to perform in public spaces in dozens of cities and countries around the world; and

WHEREAS; in Wisconsin, Make Music Day involves both professional and amateur musicians, bands, orchestras, and ensembles making music in-person and virtually—all completely free for musicians and audiences alike—and showcases a diverse array of styles and genres, from classical, hip hop, jazz, and blues to folk, pop, rock, rap, Americana, and world music; and

WHEREAS; this year, the communities participating in Make Music Day Wisconsin include Amery, Appleton, Ashland, Beloit, Cable, DeForest, Green Bay, Kenosha, Land O'Lakes, Madison, Middleton, Milwaukee, Platteville, Spooner-Shell Lake, Stevens Point, Sun Prairie, Superior, Verona, and Waunakee; and

WHEREAS; today, the state of Wisconsin joins the communities participating in Make Music Day Wisconsin in celebrating the creation of music and recognizing music as a universal language capable of uniting all Wisconsinites and people;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin,
do hereby proclaim June 21, 2026, as

MAKE MUSIC DAY WISCONSIN

throughout the State of Wisconsin, and I commend this observance
to all our state's residents.
